Process for Parents to Address Concerns

When parents have concerns about their children's education or educational setting, the following is an outline of the process to follow. The first step is to talk with the teacher(s) of the child. This should take place in a scheduled parent/teacher conference. If the parent is still not pleased with the outcome or response after working with the teacher on the specific concern, the parent needs to address his/her concerns to the principal of the school. If the parent is still not pleased with the outcome or response after meeting with the principal, the parent will need to contact system level personnel based on the specific concerns.
